Table of Examination Specifications

Effective for the 2004 Examination Cycle

1. The basic format of the provincial examination will now consist of two sections. Part A will now be assessed as selected-response items. Questions will target understanding from various SCOs.
2. **Part A: Selected Response Questions** is worth a total of 50 marks. **Items 49 and 50** will be highlighted and students will be required to complete the appropriate selected response on the basis on which section in **Unit V** they completed, section 5.1 or section 5.2.
3. The sections that separate the SCOs consist of six units:

I. WORLD WAR I
II. CHALLENGES & CHANGES
III. INTERNATIONAL TENSIONS DURING THE 1930's AND WORLD WAR II
IV. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT - THE COLD WAR
V. REGIONAL DEVELOPMENTS IN POST WAR WWII AFRICA, ASIA, MIDDLE EAST
VI. CHALLENGES OF THE MODERN ERA

Unit V. Regional Developments in Post War WWII Africa, Asia, Middle East is now divided into two sections with the choice of only one being required. Section 5.1: covers Post-world War II Africa, Asia; 5.2 Post-War II Middle East.

4. **Part B: Written Responses** will require students to answer constructed response items each worth 5 or 10 marks. The items will be presented in the section with two options for Section 5.1 or 5.2. Part B is worth a total of 50 marks.
5. Cognitive levels are as follows: 34 marks will be assessed for knowledge; 44 marks will be assessed for application; and 22 marks will be assessed for integration (higher mental processes).

The World History 3201 Provincial Examination is worth a total of 100 marks- 50 marks in selected response questions and 50 marks in constructed response questions. The examination is designed to be completed in three hours.
